Examinations are held as per KU Rules and Regulations (e.g., three Unit Tests for Honours courses and one Test examination for General courses students per year). Besides these examinations, teachers of different departments often conduct different types of class tests (written/viva) also.

- (iii) Whether the syllabus is completely covered:

1st year Syllabus is covered. Sometimes it is hardly possible to cover the syllabus completely particularly for the 2nd and 3rd year students in all departments due to shortage of teaching staff, irregular attendance of the students and due to inadequate available teaching days between the period of publications of one university results and the schedule of the next.

- (iv) If tutorial/remedial coaching are provided during any period of an academic year:

Yes. There are two UGC schemes running in the college: (i) Remedial Coaching for SC/ST students, and (ii) Entry in Services for SC/ST students outside the normal class hours during the whole academic year since 2008-09 session. The college has also allowed general students other than SC/ST students to take benefits of these schemes.

(v) No. of classes taken (per teacher per department [Hons. & Gen.] during the last 3 years

Teachers of different departments have taken classes as per class routine of the college framed at the beginning of each academic session. They have also liberty to take additional classes as and when required and demanded by the students. The basis of formation of college routine is: A Minimum of 21 classes (Hons. + Gen.) of 45 minutes duration for each class per week for full-time teachers, and 10 classes for part-time teachers, 19 classes for contractual teachers and normally 6-8 classes for Guest Teachers.

College has formed a Grievance Redressal Cell which headed by the Principal at the time of NAAC evaluation to look into grievances including ragging, if any. It is matter of pride, no single incidence of ragging has occurred since inception of the college.

Students' Union tries to maintained academic discipline of the college, motivate the students to participate in games and sports, extra curricular activities, organize different social and cultural functions under the guidance of teachers and publish college magazine.

These activities are regular and students are self motivated in this regard. Some of our students have elevated themselves to state level, national and even international sport-events and cut their mark thereupon. A few examples in this regard:

2. Three of our NSS volunteers participated in the Republic Day programmes in New Delhi, 2008,2009,2010

3. One NCC cadet achieved national record and obtained two gold medals in national shooting championship in 1990-1991.

4. Two NCC cadets obtained Governor's medal (W.B) as the best cadet of the year in 1995 and 1996 respectively.

5. Our college football team was runners up in Nadia District Non Govt.- College Football Championship, 2009-2010.

6. NCC Cadets represented in Republic Day Camp in New Delhi for consecutive six years.

Besides academic activities students of this college voluntarily participate in social service activities through NSS programme (two units of 100 enrolments each) & NCC for boys of total 160 enrolments (presently NCC unit for girls' students is suspended). These NSS & NCC Units are very regular and well functioning.

The College's mission is to impart quality knowledge and higher education to the students coming largely from rural hinterlands and economically and socially backward and minority communities and to equip them with marketable skills and ethical/human values in context of a competitive global scenario. The college tries to realize its mission through various programmes and reduce inequity in educational opportunity and social injustice.

But certain financial constraints (due to inadequacy of existing sources) have compelled us to approach state government for special assistance and a substantial grant relating to development of academic infrastructure like buildings, modernization of library and laboratory facilities, computerization of office and departments, completion of auditorium, connectivity with excellent academic institutions through opening up its own website and internet facilities etc. The objective is to widen the parameters of (with a ray of hope to increase the scope of diversification of the) need - based subjects and open up avenues to higher studies (PG) and scientific research that may relate education to gainful employment and thus serve the educational needs and aspirations of the catchments area of this institution
